The Shamong Township Committee held a Committee Meeting on the above date at the Municipal Building.

Deputy Mayor DiCroce called the meeting to order at approximately 7:30 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Deputy Mayor DiCroce opened the meeting to the public for comments, there being none, he closed the meeting to the public.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE OFFICIAL ACTION:

On motion of Committeeman Cooney, seconded by Committeeman Mozitis, it was moved to approve the minutes of May 24, 2016 regular and executive sessions. A roll call vote showed all members present voting yes.

The Deputy Clerk reported on the Road Project explaining work would start the week of July 5th with milling and repairs and the project should be completed on or about August 15th weather permitting. Residents will be notified by door hangers 48 hours prior to start of work on their road. No street parking at this time will be permitted. The contractor will also notify the Township and it will be posted on the website and/or by e-mail. Mr. Guzzi's office will prepare change orders to increase scope of work to include inlet repairs and additional road repairs permitted to 20% of contract already awarded. The roads for milling/repair are; Silver Lake Drive, Princeton Drive, Concord Drive, Cobblestone Lane, Candle Court, and speed bumps on Grassy Lake Road. Committeeman Mozitis suggested the fire company be informed of the work being done on the roads. Deputy Mayor DiCroce would like the information on the website for the residents. The Administrator will post the information when received.

RESOLUTIONS:

On motion of Committeeman Cooney, seconded by Committeeman DiCroce, it was moved to approve Resolution 2016R-68 a renewal of Alcoholic Beverage Control Plenary Retail Distribution License 0332-44-002-006 for Scoots Liquors LLC, 1004 Route 206. A roll call vote showed Committeemen Cooney and DiCroce voting yes, Committeeman Mozitis abstaining.

REPORTS:

The Deputy Clerk reported on the following issues; Shamong Night at the Pine Barren's Festival is Friday, July 29th, the Annual Recycling Tonnage Report is done and pending certification and documentation for lease financing of ambulance refurbishment has been submitted. Also, Committeemen have copies of all department revenue to date and a print out of all bank accounts with total balance to date.

Deputy Mayor DiCroce opened the meeting to the public for comments at which time Douglas Melegari with the Pine Barrens Tribune asked if the Committee had any knowledge of the coyote attack on a resident's dog in the Holly Bush area. Deputy Mayor DiCroce stated he was not aware of the situation and would get it in the newspaper so people would be aware. The Deputy Clerk explained their office learned about it from social media and was not notified by any official authority. Mr. Melegari said he contacted the animal control person and he explained he has limited authority as a control officer for the township as far as coyotes are concerned and suggested he contact the Division of Fish and Game which he did but they did not return his call. Deputy Mayor DiCroce suggested he contact the Medford Preserve to see if they have any information of coyote behavior. Committeeman Mozitis said he saw one coyote crossing Forked Neck Road in the past but that was quite some time ago. Linsey Nolan with the Shamong Sun asked if she could have what roads were going to be under construction and the Deputy Clerk read them off to her. Deputy Mayor DiCroce explained it has been a number of years since the roads were completed and now the Committee has put together a 10 year program for improving the roads in the Township. He feels the residents will be very happy with the Township doing this project. There being no further comments the public portion of the meeting was closed.

On motion of Committeeman Cooney, seconded by Committeeman Mozitis, the meeting was adjourned with all members present voting yes.
